Dear Friends:

I am pleased to issue our annual publication, Dropout Rates in Massachusetts Public Schools: 1999-00, with information on high school students who dropped out of Massachusetts public schools during the 1999-00 reporting year. This year for the first time we have also included dropout rates by grade, gender, and race for all districts. The information in this report will be useful in developing and monitoring dropout prevention services.

#### **Summary of Key Findings**

- Annual Dropout Rate The 1999-00 annual dropout rate was 3.5 percent, a slight decrease from 3.6 percent the previous year. This rate represents a total of 9,199 students enrolled in grades nine through twelve who dropped out of Massachusetts public schools in the 1999-00 school year and did not return to school by October 1, 2000.
- **Rate Over Time** The annual statewide dropout rate has remained within the range of 3.4 percent to 3.6 percent for the past five years.
- **Distribution of Rates for Individual Schools** The annual dropout rate varied widely among individual schools, ranging from zero percent to 79 percent. More than half of the schools (59 percent) had a dropout rate of 2.5 percent or less. Approximately six percent of the schools had a rate higher than ten percent.
- **Grade** Students in grade eleven dropped out at the highest rate of 3.9 percent followed by 3.7 percent for tenth graders. A rate of 3.1 percent was calculated for both ninth and twelfth graders. These differences, according to grade level, are consistent with data from previous years.
- **Gender** The 1999-00 dropout rate was 4.0 percent for males (equivalent to last year) and 2.9 percent for females (a slightly lower rate than the previous year). Males have consistently dropped out at a higher rate than females for the past several years.
- **Race/Ethnicity** Dropout rates varied widely by race/ethnicity. Hispanic students had the highest annual dropout rate at 8.2 percent followed by a rate of 6.1 percent for African-American students.

Each of these rates shows a noticeable decrease from last year's rates of 9.8 percent and 6.7 percent, respectively. Native American students had a 4.2 percent dropout rate; Asian students, a rate of 4.0 percent; and white students, a rate of 2.6 percent – all slight increases from the prior year.

• Vocational-Technical Schools The annual dropout rate for students enrolled in vocationaltechnical schools was 3.2 percent, somewhat lower than the statewide rate. The rate for city/town vocational-technical schools was 5.5 percent, and the rate for regional, independent and county vocational-technical schools was 3.2 percent. All three of these rates represent increases from last year's values.

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## Introduction

This report provides information on students who dropped out of Massachusetts public schools during the 1999-00 reporting year (July 1, 1999, to June 30, 2000). Dropouts are defined as students in grades nine through twelve who leave school prior to graduation for reasons other than transfer to another school. The Massachusetts Department of Education reports a dropout measure that was developed by the U.S. Department of Education.

According to this measure, students who drop out during a particular reporting year, but return to school by October 1 of the following year, referred to in this report as *returned dropouts*, are not counted as dropouts. The dropout rate is the number of students who drop out over a one-year period, from July 1 to June 30, minus the number of returned dropouts, divided by the October 1 enrollment. This measure will eventually be adopted by all states, allowing for comparisons between states and with the national average.

A **dropout** is defined as a student in grade nine through twelve who leaves school prior to graduation for reasons other than transfer to another school and does not re-enroll before the following October 1.

The **dropout rate** is the number of students who drop out over a one-year period, from July 1 to June 30, minus the number of returned dropouts, divided by the October 1 enrollment.

## **Analysis of Dropout Rates**

During the 1999-00 reporting year, a total of 9,199 ninth- through twelfth-graders dropped out of Massachusetts public schools and did not return to school by October 1, 2000. These students represented 3.5 percent of the 265,795 students enrolled in grades nine through twelve in the state's public schools on October 1, 1999. The 1999-00 annual dropout rate of 3.5 percent was a decrease from the previous year, when the state rate was 3.6 percent.

In addition to the 9,199 dropouts, another 1,675 students dropped out of school during the 1999-00 reporting year and were not in school at the end of the year but returned to school by October 1, 2000. These students, referred to in this report as *returned dropouts*, represented 15.4 percent of the total number of students who dropped out during the 1999-00 school year. The rates reported in this report do not include students who drop out of school in a reported year but return before the end of the same school year.

Based on the annual dropout rate for each grade level, it is projected that 13 percent of the students who entered ninth grade in the 1999-00 reporting year will have dropped out by the end of their senior year in 2003. This statistic, known as the *projected four-year dropout rate*, is an estimation of the cumulative effect of four years of students dropping out of school for the class of 2003. The projected four-year dropout rate of 13 percent for the class of 2003 decreased from the class of 2002's rate (14 percent). The projected four-year rates for the class of 1999, 2000, and 2001 were 13 percent.

The statewide dropout rate masks the wide disparity in individual school rates and the persistently high rates at some schools. Among individual schools the dropout rate ranged from a low of zero percent to a high of 79 percent<sup>1</sup>. Eighteen schools reported no dropouts in 1999-00 and another 65 schools reported dropout rates of one percent or less. Eighteen schools reported dropout rates greater than ten percent. These 18 schools comprised 6.5 percent of the state's grade nine through twelve enrollment, but accounted for 26.5 percent of the state's dropouts.



## **Results for Selected Student Populations**

Because the dropout rate varies among specific student populations, examining the rate for specific populations is important in developing and targeting dropout prevention efforts. The data collected allow for an analysis by grade level, gender, race/ethnicity, and certain types of schools.

#### Grade

• Students in grade eleven dropped out at a higher rate than did students in other grades. The 1999-00 dropout rate for eleventh-graders was 3.9 percent, followed by 3.7 percent for tenth-graders, and 3.1 percent for ninth and twelfth-graders. Each grade level has neither consistently decreased nor increased, but instead has fluctuated slightly from year to year.




#### Gender

- Consistent with previous years, the 1999-00 dropout rate was higher for males than for females. The annual rate was 4.0 percent for males, approximately a percentage point higher than the rate of 2.9 percent for females.
- The dropout rate for males stayed the same in 1999-00 as the prior year. The dropout rate of 2.9 percent for females decreased slightly from 3.1 percent the previous year.

### Race/Ethnicity

• Consistent with previous years, the dropout rates in 1999-00 varied according to race/ethnicity. As in the prior four years, the rate of 8.2 percent for Hispanic students



was the highest among the five reported race/ethnicity categories. The annual rate was 6.1 percent for African-American students and 4.2 percent for Native American students. The rate for Asian students was 4.0 and for

white students was 2.6 percent.

- The Hispanic dropout rate showed the largest change of the five reported race/ethnicity categories. The rate decreased for Hispanic students from 9.8 percent to 8.2 percent. The annual rate for African-American students decreased from 6.7 percent in 1998-99 to 6.1 percent in 1999-00. The rate for Asian students increased from the prior year, from 3.6 to 4.0 percent. The rate for white students increased slightly from 2.5 to 2.6 percent. The rate for Native American students increased from 4.0 to 4.2 percent. The rate for Native American students is susceptible to wide fluctuation due to a low number of Native American students enrolled in Massachusetts schools.
- The projected four-year dropout rate for the Class of 2003 was highest for Hispanic students at 29 percent, followed by African-American students at 22 percent and Native American students at 16 percent. The rate was 15 percent for Asian students and ten percent for white students.


#### Vocational-Technical Schools

• In 1999-00, the dropout rate for students enrolled in grades nine through twelve in the state's vocational-technical schools was 3.2 percent – a rate lower than the statewide rate. Of the vocational students who dropped out, 61 percent attended regional, county, or

independent vocational-technical schools, and the remainder attended vocational-

technical schools that were part of city and town school systems. The annual dropout rate of 5.5 percent for city/town vocational-technical schools was significantly higher than the rate of 3.2 percent for regional, county and independent vocational-technical schools.

• The annual dropout rate for all vocational-technical schools increased from 2.9 percent in 1998-



99 to 3.2 percent in 1999-00. The rate for regional vocational-technical schools increased from 2.4 to 2.6 percent, and the rate for city/town vocational-technical schools increased from 4.9 to 5.5 percent. Figure 3 illustrates the dropout rate for vocational schools compared to other schools for the 1999-00 school year. In grades nine and ten, the dropout rate for vocational schools is lower than the rate for all other schools. The opposite is true in grades eleven and twelve.

• The projected four-year dropout rate for all vocational-technical schools was 13 percent. The projected four-year rate was 21 percent for city/town vocational-technical schools and 14 percent for regional, county and independent vocational-technical schools.

#### **Charter Schools**

• During the 1999-00 school year, a total of 2,550 students in grades nine through twelve attended charter schools. Of these, 120 students dropped out, resulting in a dropout rate of 4.7 percent. Of the eighteen charter schools with any of the grades nine through twelve, six had no dropouts, six had a dropout rate between 0.1 and 3 percent, one had a rate of 4.9 percent, and three had a rate over ten percent.

#### **Returned Dropouts**

Of all students who dropped out during the 1999-00 reporting year, 15.4 percent returned to school by October 1, 2000. These students are referred to as returned dropouts. This percentage is lower than it was the prior year, when 17.6 percent of all dropouts returned to school.

- The percentage of returned dropouts varied by school. Of the 323 schools that had any of the grades nine through twelve and had dropouts during the 1999-00 reporting year, a majority (72 percent) had less than 20 percent of their dropouts re-enroll in school.
- Approximately 25 percent (82 schools) had none of their dropouts return to school by October 1, 2000. Seven schools had all of their dropouts return to school.

The percentage of returned dropouts also varied among specific populations of students. In other words, certain student populations were more likely to return to school than others (see Table 1).

- *Grade* In 1999-00, students in grade eleven (16.6 percent) were most likely to return to school, followed by grade twelve (16.5 percent), grade ten (15.9 percent) and grade nine (12.8 percent). The figures for all grades showed a decrease from the previous year.
- *Gender* Female dropouts were more likely to return to school in 1999-00 than male dropouts were. The percentage of returned dropouts for females, 15.9 percent, is a decrease from the previous year, when 16.8 percent of females who dropped out returned to school. The percentage of males who dropped out and returned to school in 1999-00 was 15.1 percent, down from 18.3 percent in 1998-99.
- *Race/Ethnicity* Asian students who dropped out were more likely to return to school than students of other racial/ethnic backgrounds. Of the Asian students who dropped out, 20.4 percent returned to school. White students (16.1 percent) were the second most likely to re-enroll, followed by African-American students (14.1 percent) and Hispanic students (13.0 percent). Native-American students (6.3 percent) were the least likely to re-enroll. For all race/ethnicity groups, the percentage of dropouts who returned to school decreased from the previous year.
- *Vocational-Technical Schools* Students at vocational-technical schools were less likely to return to school than were students statewide. Of the vocational students who dropped out, 9.5 percent returned to school, a significant decrease from 16.6 percent the prior year. Students at regional, county or independent vocational schools were slightly more likely to return to school than were students at city or town vocational schools (8.9 vs. 8.3 percent, respectively).
- *Charter Schools* Of the 129 students who dropped out of charter schools, 6.9 percent (nine students) returned to school by October 1, 2000.

## **Data Collection and Dropout Rate Calculations**

#### **Data Collection**

In accordance with the U.S. Department of Education definition, a school dropout in Massachusetts is defined as a student who leaves school prior to graduation for reasons other than transfer to another school and does not return to school by October 1 of the following reporting year. Individual public schools reported to the Department of Education the number of students who dropped out over a 12-month period beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000. Dropout figures were reported in the *Year-End School Indicator Report for 1999-00*. Schools then reported the number of dropouts who returned to school by October 1, 2000 in a supplement to the *Individual School Report*, commonly referred to as the October Enrollment Report. In both of these reports, dropouts were classified by gender within the five racial/ethnic groups across grades six through twelve. Although the Department collects data on students in grades six through eight, the reported rate represents grades nine through twelve. Data on grades six through eight are available from the Department.

#### **Dropout Rate Calculations**

#### Annual Dropout Rate

In Massachusetts, the annual dropout rate is the number of dropouts from grades nine through twelve over a single one-year reporting period, minus the number of those dropouts who returned to school by the following October 1, divided by the October 1 enrollment for that reporting period. Enrollment data for October 1, 1999, collected in the *Individual School Report*, were used to determine the 1999-00 dropout rate. Because students who drop out between July 1 and October 1 are counted as dropouts but are not included in the enrollment figure against which the number of dropouts is compared, the rates may be slightly inflated to the extent to which students drop out prior to October 1.

This is the seventh consecutive year that the Massachusetts Department of Education has reported dropout data using this measure. Prior to 1993, the Department reported a dropout rate that counted all students who dropped out of school regardless of whether they returned to school. This rate, called the *unadjusted dropout rate*, is not included in the analyses of this report. Therefore, data in this report are not comparable to data for the years prior to 1993. Data comparable with earlier years are available from the Department. The unadjusted rate for 2000 is included in the data table of annual dropout rates for schools and districts at the end of this report (Appendix A).

Annual Dropout Rate = (number of dropouts - returned dropouts) / October enrollment \* 100 Example: Statewide annual dropout rate (1999-00) = (10,874 - 1,675) / 265,795 \* 100 = 3.5%

#### Projected Four-Year Dropout Rate

The projected four-year dropout rate is determined by calculating the <u>cumulative</u> effect of four years of dropping out according to the following formula.

The methodology assumes that (1) current annual dropout rates for grades ten, eleven and twelve will remain constant over the next three years, and (2) students who drop out will not return to school *after* October 1 of the following year. Grade-specific dropout rates for individual schools, as well as projected four-year dropout rates for individual schools, are available from the Massachusetts Department of Education.
